**Charles Edward "Tot" Adams**, 81, of Liverpool died Friday, Nov. 27, 2009 at the SunHome Hospice unit at Sunbury Community Hospital.

He was born Aug. 17, 1928 in Sunbury to the late **Charles E.** and **Pauline (Keithan) Fegley**. He was the stepson of the late **David H. Fegley**.
