

**Henry Albert**, (11 Nov 1853 - 8 Dec 1937), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

**Henry Albert**, who was born in Perry County, died at his home in Alta Loma, California, Wednesday of last week at the advanced age of 84 years and 27 days. He had been ill for two months. **Mr. Albert** was born in Little Germany. His father, **George Washington Albert**, was a soldier in the Civil War and was killed in battle and **Henry**, then a young boy, was placed in a soldiers' orphan school where he received his education. Sixty-six years ago, he went to California, being employed at Requa and Crescent City, later going to Southern California, where he purchased a ranch and planted an orange grove. Prosperity crowned his efforts and he was one of the prominent citrus ranchers in San Bernardino County. His wife died in 1931. Surviving him are two daughters, **Miss Eleanor** and **Miss Mary Beaver Albert**, at home, and one son **Henry**, of Alta Loma.

**Mr. Albert** was a member of the Presbyterian Church and an intelligent, upright citizen, and a man of most generous hospitality. Anybody from Perry County visiting in California received a cordial welcome at his home. Through the many years since he left Perry County, he never forgot his old home and old friends and often visited here, the late **Judge James W. Schull** being his cousin. Funeral services were held in the Upland Presbyterian church, Saturday, December 11, the Rev Rex E Lawhead and the Rev. RC Stone officiating, and burial was in Bellevue Cemetery in Ontario, California.
