William Brothers “Bill” **Albright**, 78, died Monday, Sept. 19, 2011.

He was born May 12, 1933 to the late **Clayton** “C.L.” and **Margaret Albright** of Duncannon.

He was in the Air Force for 20 years and after retiring began a second career in elementary education, teaching in the Pulaski County Special School District for 19 years and then as a substitute teacher; received the Patriotism Award in 2005 from the Military Order of the World Wars, and had taught flag education and respect for the American flag to fifth-graders in his school district; a member of First Baptist Church, Jacksonville, Ark., where he had worked as a temporary youth director, helping youth earn money for summer trips to Glorietta, N.M., and Ridgecrest, N.C.; and an avid model train collector and a member of Lionel Collectors Club of America for many years.

Surviving are his wife of 56 years, **Wilma Lois Albright**; three daughters, **Tina Albright** of Benton; **Terrie Pope** of Little Rock and **Tammie Mathis** of Cabot; a grandson, **Clayton Holderfield**; a brother, **Craig** of Harrisburg; and three sisters, **Jessie Frye**, **Norma Jones** of Duncannon and **Kate Kingsborough** of Carlisle.

He was preceded in death by two sisters, **Jean Adams** of California and **Bettymae Bowshot** of Harrisburg.

Services were held Sept. 23 in his church. Burial was in Chapel Hill Memorial Park. Moore’s Jacksonville Funeral Home, Ark., handled arrangements.
