

Arthur Elliott Barnett, (Died May 1911), Patriot, Monday, May 15, 1911, Former New Bloomfield Lawyer Succumbs to Brief Illness with Pleurisy

New Bloomfield, May 15. – Word has just been received by relatives in this place of the death of **Athur E. Barnett**, at his home in Beaver, after an illness of about ten days from pleurisy. His brother, **James M. Barnett**, and his sister, **Mrs. James S. Ramsay**, of this place, had been sent for and were with him at the time of his death.

Arthur Elliott Barnett was a son of **Hon. Charles A.** and **Mary (McClure) Barnett**, of this place, and grew to young manhood here. He read law in his father's office, and after his admission to the bar, located in Beaver about ten years ago, where he built up a good practice, and was one of the prominent attorneys of this place. He was married in 1902 to Miss **Mary Cromleigh**, of this place, who survives him, with three little children, the oldest of whom is but seven years old. He is also survived by his father, his sister, **Mrs. James S. Ramsay**, and two brothers, **James M.** and **Ralph L. Barnett**, all of this place, and a brother, **Charles A. Barnett, Jr.**, of New York City. He was 35 years old. Interment will be made in the cemetery in this place, but arrangement have not yet been made for the funeral.

Patriot, Monday, May 22, 1911, Funeral of **Arthur E. Barnett**, Former New Bloomfield Resident Was Interred With Masonic Rites

New Bloomfield, May 21. – Funeral services of **Arthur E. Barnett**, who died last Saturday at his home in Beaver, were held in the Presbyterian Church in that place on Monday afternoon. Services were held only at the grave, and were conducted by Rev. I. Potter Hayes, of the Presbyterian Church, assisted by Rev. J. S. Roddy, of Philadelphia. The funeral rites of the Masonic order were conducted by Adams Lodge, of this place. A number of friends from Beaver attended the funeral services here also friends and relatives from Harrisburg, Lewistown, Duncannon and other points in this state.
