

Fredrick K. Barrick, (1836 – 12 Aug 1899), Palo Alto Reporter, August 18, 1899

On Friday, Aug. 12th, occurred the death of **Mr. Frederick Barrick**, who lived one mile southeast of Mallard, Iowa. **Mr. Barrick** never fully recovered from his sickness contracted in the war of the Rebellion. On the 4th of July last he was taken to his bed catarrh of the stomach being the ailment to which he succumbed. He recently remarked: "I have been fighting for life for the last thirty years, but shall fight no-longer."

He was a member of the Methodist Church and during his intense suffering he never complained, but often testified of his assurance in the hope of eternal life. He leaves a wife and seven children.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Simpson, his pastor. A very large concourse of friends paid their last respects to the earthly remains of a good neighbor, and a kind and sympathetic husband and father. The interment was made in the Stratton cemetery.
