

**Catherine Bernheisel**, (Died 1 Feb 1888), Patriot, Thursday, February 2, 1888; **Mrs. Catherine Bernheisel** Taken Sick at Market and Suddenly Expires.

Yesterday morning about 10 o'clock **Mrs. Catherine Bernheisel** died suddenly at her residence, No. 904 Cowden Street. She had been at market as usual, and while returning home was taken ill. She managed to reach her home, and sat down, but almost immediately fell over, exclaiming to her daughter, "I believe I am dying!" Her death was almost instantaneous. Word was immediately sent to her husband, who is in the employ of Mr. Coover, Market square, and to other members of the family. Dr. Fred W. Coover was called in, but death had already occurred. Coroner Shindler was notified, but held no inquest and the cause of death is not known, though it was probably due to some affection of the heart. **Mrs. Bernheisel** was in the 53<sup>rd</sup> year of age. She was a native of Blair County, her maiden name being **Catherine Winters**. She was the mother of eight children. A son **Charles**, a printer is in Cincinnati; **Mrs. Snyder**, a married woman, resides on Wallace Street; the others resided with their parents.
