

**Dora (Rhoads) Bistline**, (1875 – 1941), Duncannon Record, Thursday, May 29, 1941

Mrs. **Dora Bistline**, employed as matron of the kitchen at the Tressler Orphans Home, Loysville, died at the home of her nephew, **Newton Flickinger**, near Blain, Sunday morning about 4 o'clock of a lingering illness.

She was employed in the kitchen at the T.O.H. over nineteen years and had just gone to the Flickinger home on Easter Sunday, April 13th where she was cared for.

She was the daughter of **Samuel** and **Sarah (Stum) Rhoads** and was born in Blain. Her husband, **William Bistline**, died twenty-one years ago. Since her marriage she had resided mostly at the T.O.H. and in the vicinity of Loysville. One sister, Mrs. **Sally Flickinger**, Lewistown, survives her.

She was a member of the Blain Methodist Church and funeral services which were held at the Flickinger home on Tuesday at 2 p.m. were conducted by a former pastor, Rev. Lewis Wible, Altoona, and burial was in the Methodist Cemetery, Blain. The pallbearers, nephews of the deceased, were; **Samuel, George, Ross, Frank, Newton** and **Benjamin Flickinger**.
