

Amos Bonsall, (31 Aug 1822 – 5 Nov 1822), DuBois Morning Courier, Friday, November 7, 1913; Death of an Old Resident

Amos Bonsall, one of the oldest and most highly respected residents of Brady Township, died Wednesday evening at his home. Death was due to internal troubles resulting from a cancerous growth on his thumb, and indirectly to old age, the deceased being 91 years, 2 months and 5 days old at the time of his death. He is survived by two sons and one daughter, one of the sons, **A. J. Bonsall**, living at the homestead. The funeral party will leave the home at 10 o'clock Saturday morning and will drive to the Troutville Church where the services will be conducted by Rev. Selner. Interment will be in the Union cemetery near Troutville.

Amos Bonsall came to Brady Township about eighty-nine years ago, when he was two years of age, and has been a resident of that section since that time. He lived a life of honesty and integrity, an upright Christian life, and was one of the best loved and most highly respected citizens of that community. His death will be mourned by a host of friends and acquaintances as that of a thoroughly good man.
