

Sarah Elizabeth (Kough) Bosserman, (6 Jul 1822 -14 Apr 1901), Newport News, Thursday, April 18, 1901.

Sarah Elizabeth Bosserman second wife of **John W. Bosserman**, died at 9 o'clock last Sunday morning, having been ill a week of pneumonia. She had been in delicate health from the grip all winter. She was a daughter of **John** and **Eleanor Kough**, and was born at the **Kough homestead**, at Sulphur Springs, Juniata Township, nearly 79 years ago.

Mr. Bosserman, to whom she was married by Rev. Rodenbaugh on October 14, 1851. He had owned the corner that is now known as the Hotel Graham, where he kept a store. Selling out in the spring of 1851, he went to Ottawa and bought a farm, but before his wife could join him there, he took sick and died. His body was buried at Ottawa. They had three children, all of whom are dead, **Mrs. A.C. Clemens** is her step-daughter; Mrs. **Jacob Sanserman**, of this place (Newport), and **Jacob Kough**, of East Waterford, Juniata County, are her only surviving sister and brother of a family of eight children. **Mrs. Bosserman** was a member of the Christian Church at Sulphur Springs from childhood.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, at the Lutheran church, Rev. Henry Harms officiating. Interment in Newport Cemetery, alongside the body of her son, **Melvin**, who came home from the war and died in 1865 at the age of 20. Her other two sons died in infancy.
