

**John Brady**, (12 Jul 1949 – 14 Sep 2009), Perry County Times, Thursday, September 24, 2009

**John "Jack" Brady**, 60, of Duncannon died Monday, Sept. 14, 2009 at the Harrisburg Hospital.

He was born July 12, 1949 to the late **John M. and Elizabeth Mae (Young) Brady**.

He was a former employee of 35 years of Canteen Vending Company; a 1967 graduate of Central Dauphin East High School and attended Shippensburg University; in his early years earned a black belt in Isshinryu karate and worked his way up to third-degree; a lifetime member of NRA and an NRA certified instructor and range officer, a co-captain of AMP Pistol League, participant of Camp Perry National Pistol Marksmanship Competition, member of Duncannon Sportsmen's Club, lifetime member and former vice president of Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers, where he took part in teaching many classes including basic handgun safety and other NRA-related classes.

He taught evening classes in refrigeration at Cumberland Perry Vo-Tech and was a lifetime member of RSES-Refrigeration Services and Engineering Society. He was a former chairman of the finance committee and served on church council at Zion Lutheran Church, Penbrook and a former member of Penbrook Athletic Association and Penbrook Borough Council. He enjoyed computers, photography and educating and participating in handgun activities.

Surviving are his wife of 40 years, **Susan** of Duncannon; three sons and their families, **John M.**, of Eppers, **Joseph M.** and his wife, **Tianna**, and 5-month-old grandson, **Logan**, and **Jason M.** and wife, **Brittany**, of Halifax; and two brothers, **Paul "Steve"** of Everett and **Patrick** of Richfield.

He was preceded in death by a sister, **Loretta Brady Stadler**.

Services were held Sept. 18 in Hetrick-Bitner Funeral Home, Harrisburg, with the Rev. Walter Hafer officiating. Burial was be in Shoop's Cemetery, Garden of Rest.
