**Edward G. “Moe” Briner**, 90, of Marysville died Friday, Dec. 9, 2011 at Holy Spirit Hospital, Camp Hill.

He was born Aug. 26, 1921 in Harrisburg to **Roy Dewey** and **Esther (Sponsler) Briner**.
