

Harry E. Brothers, (6 Jun 1872 – 15 Oct 1895), The Weekly Argus News, Saturday, October 19, 1895, Crawfordsville, Indiana; Death of **Harry Brothers** – After a Two Weeks Illness of Typhoid Fever

The many friends of **Harry Brothers**, second son of **Mr. and Mrs. J. S. Brothers**, will be shocked to hear of his death which occurred at 1:30 o'clock Tuesday morning. He was 23 years of age and was born in Duncannon, Pa. His parents came to Crawfordsville in 1880 from New Jersey and he has grown to manhood in this city. Two weeks ago **Harry** was apparently in the best of health, but was taken ill with typhoid fever which terminated in his death despite all that a physician's skill could do. **Harry** was married May 15, 1892, to **Miss Daisy Bayless**. Both were quite young but their married life has been prosperous and happy. To them was born a son now two years of age. He held a responsible position under his father, who is roadmaster of the Vandalia, and was fast making a reputation for himself. But death loved a shining mark and **Harry** brave, noble hearted boy is numbered among the fallen. He was a member of the Uniform Rank, Knights of Pythias; and they had charge of the funeral services which occurred Thursday at 2 o'clock conducted by Rev. Creighton at the home of his parents 900 east Main Street.
