

Mary A. (Zeigler) Cameron, (16 Jul 1845 – 25 Feb 1913), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

Mrs. Mary A. Cameron, relict of the late **Robert Cameron**, of Carroll Township died suddenly at the home of her daughter, **Mrs. Laura Blosser**, in Carlisle, Saturday evening of last week. She had been making her home for the most part, with her daughter, **Mrs. W.W. Hair**, of this place (New Bloomfield) since the death of her husband and on Friday they both went to Carlisle to visit relatives. **Mrs. Cameron** had just retired when she complained of being very ill and asked to be helped down the stairs. This was done and a physician quickly summoned, but before he arrived she was dead. Her death is attributed to acute indigestion affecting a weak heart.

The deceased was a daughter of the late **Samuel** and **Mary (Dunkelberger) Zeigler**, and was born near Perry Furnace, July 16, 1845 and at her death was aged 67 years, 6 months, 15 days. Forty-eight years ago she wedded **Robert Cameron** of Carroll Township, who died September 20, 1907. There survive from this union the following children; **Mrs. Andrew Blosser**, of Carlisle; **John M. Cameron**, of New Kingston; **Samuel C. Cameron**, of Shermans Dale; **Mrs. W.W. Hair** of this place. The following brothers and sisters also survive; **Alfred Zeigler** of Falling Springs; **John Zeigler** of Carlisle; **Mrs. David Stone**, **Mrs. G.W. Messimer**, **Mrs. Joseph Eberly**, all of Carroll Township; **Mrs. Ellen Killinger** in the west.

The deceased was a consistent Christian and since childhood had been a member of the U.B. Church. She was a devoted wife and parent and was greatly beloved by a large circle of relatives and friends.

Short funeral service was held a Carlisle Wednesday morning and the body conveyed to Young's Church, where funeral services will be held by her pastor, Rev. Harry Boyer, followed by interment in the graveyard adjoining the church.
