

Earl Henry Chubb, (14 Oct 1906 – 10 Oct 1971), Daily Item, Monday, October 11, 1971, Sunbury

Millerstown - **Earl Henry Chubb**, 64, of Millerstown RD 2, died Sunday at 1:45 p.m. at Polyclinic Hospital, Harrisburg. He was admitted to the hospital Oct. 5 following an attack at Millerstown and death was attributed to a heart attack.

A native of Millerstown RD 2, Mr. Chubb was educated in the Juniata County school system. He farmed in that county for a number of years, later working on road construction.

From 1940 to 1947 he was employed by Harrisburg Steel Corp. He returned to road construction in 1947, and continued in that capacity until 1962, when he retired due to ill health.

Mr. Chubb was married to the former **Margaret DeWalt** of Newport.

He was born Oct. 14, 1906, at Millerstown RD 2, the son of the late **Frank I.** and **Bertha Frontz Chubb**.

A member of St. James United Methodist Church and Sunday School, Millerstown RD 2, **Mr. Chubb** also held membership in the Loyal Order of Moose, Lodge No. 925, Millerstown.

Surviving in addition to his widow, are three daughters, **Mrs. Carl S. Smith** of Liverpool, **Mrs. Richard Diehl** and **Mrs. Terence Goodling**, both of Millerstown RD 2; two sons, **Donald W. Chubb** of Middleburg and **Robert E. Chubb** of Liverpool; three grandchildren; three sisters, **Mrs. Ross Delancey** of Millerstown, **Mrs. John Willow** of Millerstown RD 2 and **Mrs. Ida Miller** of Harrisburg; two brothers, **Leroy Chubb** of Loysville and **Donald I. Chubb** of Middleburg RD 2 and a number of nieces, nephews and cousins.

He was preceded in death by a granddaughter in infancy and one brother.

Funeral services will be conducted on Wednesday at 3 p.m. from the George P. Garman Funeral Home, 606 N. Front St., Liverpool, with the pastor, the Rev. Charles A. Bailey, officiating, assisted by the Rev. Theodore Lindquist Jr., pastor of the Liverpool Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd. Interment will follow in St. James Church Cemetery, Millerstown RD 2.
