

Fannie (Comp) Clouser (11 Jun 1819 – 27 Nov 1915), Perry County Times, November 25, 1915.

Mrs. **Fanny Clouser** died at the home of her son, **Jay. L. Clouser**, in this place, last Saturday shortly after noon. Her death was due to the failing powers due to her great age. Her end peaceful, like one falling asleep, her powers weakened gradually until life ebbed out. She was remarkably preserved while the head with the exception of her eyesight, which had failed her in recent years, she was able to go about in the house.

The deceased was a daughter of the late **Andrew** and **Mary [Shover] Comp**, and she was born in Centre Township, June 11, 1819, and at her death was aged 96 years, 5 months, and 16 days. She spent practically all her days in the neighborhood. She had lived with her son, **Jay. L. Clouser**, for the past 30 years.

In 1844 she was wedded to **Simon S. Clouser**, who died in 1888. From this union nine children were born, the following surviving; **John A.**, **Samuel**, **Benjamin F.**, **Joseph L.**, all residing in this place; **Jane**, **Mrs. Cornelius Clouser**, of Centre Township; Carrie, **Mrs. A. W. Light**, of Harrisburg, **Mary E. Bear**, **Mrs. Elizabeth Clouser**, and **Andrew Clouser** are dead. No brothers or sisters survive, she being the last of her family. There also survives 62 grandchildren, 104 great-grandchildren and eight great great grandchildren.

The deceased had been a consistent member of the Lutheran Church for over 76 years. She was a devoted wife and mother.

Funeral services were held at her late residence Tuesday morning, at 10 o'clock, her pastor, Jay. W. Weeter officiating, and taking as his text II Cor. 5:1, "for we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the hands." Interment was made in the cemetery, her four sons being pallbearers.
