Cochran, Rev. Win. P., D. D., was born in Greenwood Township, Perry County, in 1803. He graduated at Princeton College in his twenty second year. In 1825 he went to Missouri as a Home Missionary. He finally became settled as the owner of a plantation and pastor of a Presbyterian Church in Marion County, Missouri, where he remained until the breaking out of the rebellion, when he received a call from the Presbyterian Churches of Millerstown, Newport and Ickesburg (Buffalo Church), which he accepted, and removed his family to Millerstown. He continued to discharge the duties of pastor over these congregations until the spring of 1868, when he resigned and returned to his old home in Missouri.
