

Anna Alice (Dunkelberger) Comp, (5 Dec 1853 – 7 May 1918), People's Advocate and Press, May 22, 1918, New Bloomfield, PA

Mrs. W.F. Comp died at her home in this place, Friday night after an illness of little more than a week. On the 7th inst. she was stricken with paralysis and while she seemingly rallied at times yet her decline was gradual until death claimed her. She had been in failing health the past eight years.

The maiden name of the deceased was **Anna Alice Dunkelberger**, of Spring Township, where she was born, December 5, 1853. She was consequently aged at her death, 64 years, 5 months, and 11 days.

February 18, 1875, she was joined in marriage with **W.F. Comp**, of Carroll Township, by Rev. W.H. Herbert. **Mr. Comp** survived her without issue. Her married life was spent with **Mr. Comp** on his farm in Carroll Township until March of 1897, since which time they have resided in this place.

The deceased is survived by the following sisters and brothers, all of whom were present at the funeral; **Sara Ellen**, (**Mrs. Wm. Baer.**) of Tyrone, Pa.; **Ida Laura**, (**Mrs. Ed. D. Stambaugh**) of Pittsburgh, Pa.; **Alfred H. Dunkelberger**, of Spring Township; **Mrs. Annie L. Bossler** nee **Durham**, now a resident of Harrisburg; **Harry L. Zinn**, now of Lewisberry, York County, Pa.; and **Levi Shearer**, now of Pittsburgh, were raised by **Mr. and Mrs. Comp**, and the first two were present at the funeral. No parents could have been kinder to the above.

Mrs. Comp became a communicant member of Christ Lutheran Church, of this place in 1880, under the ministry of Rev. Dr. A.H. Spangler. She led a consistent Christian life and was active in the various enterprises of the church until ill-health forbade. She was a woman who found her greatest pleasure in her home life and she was a most congenial companion to her devoted husband, who is sorely stricken in his great loss.

Funeral services were held at her late residence Monday morning at 10 a.m. Rev. J.W. Weeter, her pastor preached a comforting sermon. Rev. Dr. A.H. Spangler, of Yeagertown, a former pastor, and Rev. J. Thomas Fox, of Trinity Reformed Church, this place assisted. The pallbearers were; **E.H. Tressler, J.M. Seager, V.B. Clark, Henry Fleisher, D.A. Kline, John Hallman.**
