

**Jacob Drawbaugh**, (12 Nov 1852 – 14 Sep 1911), Advocate and Press, September 20, 1911

On Thursday morning **Jacob Drawbaugh** died at his home near the Dale, of typhoid fever. He and his aged sister, **Miss Mary**, have lived on the old homestead all their lives. He and his brother **David**, now deceased, carried on a good business at their sawmill for many years. Later he farmed and his services were often in demand amongst his neighbors to attend their stock when sick, he having a natural turn for that business. He was the youngest of his family and is survived by his sister, **Elizabeth Studebaker**, of Erie, **Mary** at home, **Sarah Stewart** of the Dale and **Susie Shatto** of the Dale, whose husband, **Isaac Shatto**, was buried on Friday, the day previous to **Mr. Drawbaugh's** burial, the latter's funeral being Saturday, at the old Lutheran Church near Fleisher's. He was aged 61 years, 10 months and 4 days. Rev. Boyer conducted the funeral services.

**Mrs. E. Studebaker** is visiting her sister, **Miss Drawbaugh**, having arrived here a few hours before her brother **Jacob's** death, from Erie, where she makes her home part of the year with one of her sons who is a skilled medical practitioner of that city.
