

Hiram Jefferson Dudley, (3 Apr 1856 – 26 Feb 1887)

Duncannon Record March 14, 1887 - Typhoid pneumonia to an harm lying extent in the lower part of Duncannon. **Clinton Chisolm, Hiram J. Dudley, Thomas Matlock** and **Andrew Morrison**, all employed at the Merchant Mill, are seriously ill.

The Duncannon Record, March 4, 1887 - Saturday morning, February 26, **Hiram Dudley**, aged 30 years, 10 months, and 23 days, died at his home in Lower Duncannon, leaving a wife and two children to mourn his early death. **Mr. Dudley** was born and resided all his life in this place and was a young man of much worth, and was esteemed by all who knew him, was a hard working industrious employee of the Iron Company from the time he was able to work up to within a short time previous to his death. His disease was typhoid pneumonia, which from the first, caused his friends to fear that he never would recover and which, after about ten days, ended his life. He leaves many friends and relatives who are almost inconsolable at the loss they have sustained. He was a member of the Burial Association of this place, and was buried on Monday at 2 o'clock in the U.B. Cemetery. Rev O.E. Huston officiating.
