

**Charles T. Duncan**, (18 Sep 1869 – 11 Oct 1932), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

**Chas. T. Duncan**, aged 63 years, 23 days, died suddenly at his home near Mechanicsburg, Tuesday while at the supper table, death being due to paralysis of the heart. He had suffered attacks previously but was able to walk out around yet on Monday. **Mr. Duncan** was a son of **James** and **Emma (Hagar) Duncan** of Falling Springs and was married to **Miss Mary Zeigler**, a daughter of **Alfred Zeigler**, deceased and wife, also of near there. They resided in the vicinity of Falling Spring for eleven years before moving to Cumberland County, where they have since resided. He was a farmer by occupation. Surviving him are his wife, a daughter **Ethel**, **Mrs. Robert Waggoner** of New Kingston, and two sons **John** and **Woodrow** at home; five grandchildren, two brothers, **John Duncan** and **David Duncan** and a sister, **Sara**, **Mrs. Timothy Heckard**, all of Harrisburg. Funeral services were held Sunday in the Stone Church near Wertzville and burial was made in the adjoining cemetery. His sister-in-law, **Mrs. J. H. Smeigh** and family, **Esther Zeigler** and his brother-in-law **Chas. Zeigler**, wife and son **Joe**, also **Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Sherer**, **Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Bistline** and son **Alvy**, near Falling Springs and his cousin **D. M. Duncan**, wife and daughter **Emma**, Oak Grove and **Kathryn Adams**, Markelville, attended the funeral.
