

**Wilbert A. 'Webb' Duncan**, (21 Aug 1876 – 29 Mar 1934), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

**Wilbert A. Duncan**, 57, of Marysville RD died early Sunday in a Harrisburg Hospital. He was a laborer for a landscaper prior to his illness.

**Mr. Duncan** was a member of the Bethel Evangelical United Brethren Church. Survivors include his mother, **Mrs. Annie E. Duncan**, Landisburg RD; four sisters, **Mrs. David Clouser**, Landisburg, **Mrs. Lillian Low**, Shermans Dale RD, five brothers, **George Walter** and **Clarence Duncan**, all of Marysville RD and **John**, Carlisle, and **Horace**, Landisburg RD.

Services were held Wednesday morning at the funeral home, 212 Maple Avenue, Marysville. The Rev. John R. Shafer, pastor of the Middlesex Church, officiated. Burial was made in the Grier's Point Cemetery.
