

**Smiley T. Dunkleberger**, (14 Sep 1853 – 26 Apr 1932), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

**Smiley Dunkleberger**, aged 78 years, 7 months and 12 days, died at his home near Falling Springs, Tuesday about 5 a.m. He suffered a paralytic stroke, two years ago, since which time his health had gradually grown worse and the last twelve weeks he was bedfast....

**Mr. Dunkleberger** was a son of **Samuel** and **Mary Ann (Loy) Dunkleberger**, of near Falling Springs, and was married to **Miss Clara Wertz**, of this same vicinity, who was with an only child, a son, **Gordon Dunkleberger**, of Elliottsburg, survives, as do also two grandchildren, **Rhoda** and **Roland Dunkleberger**, and a half-sister **Frances, Mrs. J. E. Wilson**, of Loysville. Two sisters and two brothers preceded him in death: **Mrs. Kate Payne**, of New Bloomfield; **Mrs. Sue Gallagher**, of Duncannon; **Josiah Dunkleberger** and **John L. Dunkleberger**, both of near Falling Springs.

He was a member of the Mt. Zion Lutheran Church and of the Home Department of the Sunday School. In former years he was a member of the Senior Mechanics Lodge, of Shermans Dale.... Funeral services will be held at the residence this afternoon at 2.30, his pastor, Rev. J. Grover C. Knipple, officiating. Burial will be in the Mt. Zion cemetery...
