

Major Joseph V. Einstein, (Died 3 Sep 1906), Patriot, Tuesday, September 4, 1906. Major Joseph V. Einstein Died Suddenly of Heart Failure.

Major Joseph V. Einstein, aged fifty-seven years, a former prominent business man of this city, died suddenly at 4.30 o'clock Monday morning, at the Hotel Johnson, Duncannon, where he was Summering. Mr. Einstein had been slightly ill for the past few days, but the end came suddenly from heart disease.

He was born in York County in 1849, and came to this city in 1857. He engaged in the dry goods business with his father, and when he died became a member of the firm of Einstein Brothers, from which he retired several years ago.

Mr. Einstein was an enthusiastic member of the National Guard during his youth and held the rank of Major during the riots of 1877. He was a charter member of the Social Club until a few years ago, when he removed his residence to his cottage on the Juniata River, above the Aqueduct.

He is survived by a son, **Morris G. Einstein**, of Philadelphia, and two sisters, Miss **Cella Einstein**, and **Mrs. Thomas J. Finney**; and a brother, **Edgar V. Einstein**, of New York.

The funeral service will be held from the residence of Maurice E. Finney, 1407 North Front Street. The time of service will be announced later.
