

Margaret J. (Soule) Ensminger, (1878 – December 1902), People's Advocate and Press, December 24, 1902

We learned with deep regret of the death of **Mrs. George M. Ensminger**, which occurred at her residence, in Marysville, Tuesday of last week, from bilious fever. She had been ill for several weeks, and hope was entertained for her complete recovery, but a relapse occurred ending fatally.

The deceased was the daughter of the late **J. W. Soule** and **wife**, of Centre Township, and was her youngest daughter. February 1, 1899 she was joined in wedlock with **George M. Ensminger**, of Marysville. Their married life had been a happy one. Two children blessed this union -- a **daughter**, who died in infancy, and then infant **son**, but a few weeks old, who survives. A husband, other and three brothers; **Harry L.** of Centre Township; and **E.S.L. Soule**, of Newport, and **Herbert** of this place, and three sisters; **Misses Mary** and **Blanche**, of this place, and **Elizabeth** -- **Mrs. Thomas Donaghy**, of Philadelphia, survived.

The funeral was held in Marysville on Thursday morning, interment at that place. She was in her 24th year.

Mrs. Ensminger was a bright and attractive lady, and a devoted and active member of the United brethren Church. Her death in young womanhood is particularly sad, but she died in the faith. Our deepest sympathies go out to the bereaved family.
