

**William Ewing, Jr.** (31 Aug 1809 – 16 Mar 1890), Unknown Source

**William Ewing** was the son of **William Ewing**, who lived midway between Andersonburg and Blain, in Perry County, Pa., where **William Jr.**, was born in the year 1809, the father dying in 1841, and was buried at Blain. The deceased was married to **Miss Sarah Allison**, of near Mechanicsburg, Pa., and this union was blessed with nine children, namely, **Margaret**, married to **John Neely**, of Tuscarora Township; **James**, married to **Sarah Bear**, and resides in Fayette Township; **Ellen**, married to **James McClure** of Tuscarora Township; **Mary**, married to **A. W. Snyder**, of Altoona, Pa.; **William H.**, married to **Maggie Milliken**, and resides in Liberty Valley, Perry County; **Dr. John W.**, deceased; **Sarah**, widow of **William A. Milliken**, of Beale Township; **Lizzie**, who resides with her brother, **Samuel** at Thompsontown; **Samuel**, married to **Ada Leonard**.

He came to Juniata County in company with his family and aged mother, about 45 years ago, and took up his residence on a farm owned by Judge Joseph Morrison, at Pleasant view, where he lived for many years. He afterwards removed to the Delancy farm, in Spruce Hill Township.

From thence he removed to S. D. Kepner's farm in Turbett Township. He afterwards removed to the Minnichan Farm, opposite Port Royal, remaining there until April 1, 1889, at which time he removed to T. S. Thompson's farm, at Thompsontown, where he died March 15, 1890, in the 81st year of his age. His faithful and devoted wife died December 28, 1888.

Mr. Ewing had seven brothers and two sisters; and two brothers, **Anthony**, of Mt. Union, Pa., and **Daniel**, of near Romney, Virginia, and one sister, **Mrs. Mary Patton**, of Beaver Falls, Pa. survive him. His brother **Joseph** is buried at Mt. Union [ Morrison Cemetery, Kistler, Mifflin Co., Pa.]; **James**, at McCullochs Mills; **John**, at Logansport, Indiana; **Armstrong**, at Middletown, Pa., afterwards his remains were raised and reinterred in the old cemetery at Carlisle; **David**, at Muscatine, Iowa; His sister, Mrs. **Hannah Beale**, wife of **William Beale**, is buried at Hartwood, Stafford County, Virginia. The **mother** of these children is buried in the Presbyterian Cemetery at Academia. The remains of the deceased members of this once large family are scattered widely, no two of them reposing in the same cemetery.
