

Harvey Fisher, (Died 31 Aug 1885), Patriot, Wednesday, September 2, 1885 Harvey Fisher, Esq, of Duncannon, Dies at Atlantic City.

Harvey Fisher, Esq., of Duncannon, is dead. On Monday evening the ad news was telegraphed from Atlantic City, to which place he had gone for the benefit of his health a short time ago. **Mr. Fisher** was well known in this city and at one time was a resident here. He was a native of Philadelphia, and while in that city some times since had a stroke of paralysis but had sufficiently recovered to again be about. A number of years ago he took up residence in Duncannon, engaging in the manufacture of iron in which business he was identified until his death. Four years ago he formed one of the firm of Buchanan & Fisher, engaged in the making of iron from refuse and slag at a small furnace in the First ward, which was consumed by fire last winter. Not long ago **Mr. Fisher** organized the firm of Fisher, Ferguson & Company located at Colebrook, Lebanon, where it was intended to manufacture patent sash weights. **Mr. Fisher** was liked by all who knew him. He was courteous and upright in business, prompt in the performance of any duties that befell him and won the confidence of all who came in contact with him, and especially those who labored in the works over which he had control. His death will be mourned by a large number of citizens of Duncannon as well as here and elsewhere. He was a member of the Harrisburg club and was admired by all. His remains will be interred at Germantown on Thursday afternoon at 4 o'clock. **Mr. Fisher** was about 40 years of age.
