

**William Flickinger**, (7 Feb 1839 – 15 Jun 1904), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

**William Flickinger**, a highly respected citizen of Newport, died suddenly of heart failure Wednesday afternoon of last week, aged 65 years, 4 months and 8 days. He was stricken with rheumatism in April in his left arm, which later spread to his body, terminating fatally. He was a shoemaker by trade. Deceased was a veteran of the Civil war, having served in Co. G., 133d P. V., and was wounded at Fredericksburg and sent home, but reenlisted in Co. F., 104th P. V., serving until the close of the war. He had been a resident of Newport since 1869. Nov. 1, 1876, he was married to Miss **Laura Liggett**. Two children resulted from this union; Miss **Marion**, a teacher in Puerto Rico, who is now on her way home, and **Harold**, in the western part of the State. He is survived by the following brothers and sister: **John** of Sandy Hill, **George** of Carlisle, **Benjamin** of Marysville, **Harry** of Philadelphia, **Martin**, who had been associated with him in business for many years, and Mrs. **Susan Wagner** of Oliver Township.
