

Dana K. (Brown) Foltz, (7 Mar 1939 – 27 May 2010), Perry County Times, Thursday, June 10, 2010

Dana K. Foltz, 71, of Middle Paxton Twp. (Stony Creek) died Thursday, May 27, 2010 in Community General Osteopathic Hospital, Harrisburg.

She was born March 7, 1939 in the former Harrisburg Keystone Hospital to the late **Henry D.** and **Kathryn L. Brown** of Fishing Creek Valley, Middle Paxton Twp.

She retired from the American Red Cross, Harrisburg Chapter, as director of disaster services and received a proclamation, "Dana K. Foltz Day," from Harrisburg Mayor Stephen R. Reed on Sept. 23, 1988 for being a compassionate leader in the critical field of disaster services. She established and managed shelters during Hurricanes Agnes and Eloise and assisted victims of fires, floods and other emergencies locally and nationally.

She was a 1957 graduate of Central Dauphin High School; an elder at Hope United Presbyterian Church, Dauphin, where she was active in church programs and a member of the church choir; an officer in the Dauphin Middle Paxton Historic Society, treasurer of Penn Gardens Civic Club and a member of Capital City Chapter of Order of the Eastern Star; and enjoyed hiking, gardening, biking, camping, singing, coaching girls' softball, being a youth group leader and relaxing at her log cabin at Raystown Lake.

Surviving are her husband of 50 years, **Calvin H. Foltz**; a daughter, **Kathy L. Garman** of Shermans Dale; a brother, **Gary Brown**, and a sister, **Kathy Westfall**, both of Middle Paxton Twp.; and many nieces and nephews.

Services were held June 2 in her church with the Rev. Dr. John L. Sproat officiating.

Burial was in Duncannon Cemetery.
