Earl B. Frey, 89, of Marysville died Saturday, June 20, 2009 at Kinkora Pythian Home, Duncannon.

He was born Aug. 23, 1919 in Manor Twp., Lancaster County, to the late **Jacob Edwin** and **Mary Jane (Strickler) Frey**.
