

Fredda L. (Collier) Hare, (15 Jan 1917 – 18 May 2009), Perry County Times, Thursday, May 28, 2009

Fredda L. Hare, 92, died Monday, May 18, 2009.

She was born Jan. 15, 1917 in Marysville, the daughter of a railroader and farmer, **Russell W. Collier**, and **Annie Smith**, of Dellville.

She operated a hair salon in the late 1940s on the square in downtown Harrisburg, worked at Bethlehem Steel Mill during World War II, worked for Mary Sach's, Coterall's, Miller's Auto and Caterpillar, and retired after 10 years of service with the State Police Comptroller's Office; after retirement, she enjoyed volunteered with Holy Spirit Hospital for 13 years; taught herself to play classical music on piano; and enjoyed swimming at the YMCA, babysitting her grandchildren, studying songbirds and butterflies, dancing and reminiscing about the Valencia and Hershey ballrooms, the ocean and deep sea fishing, antiques, roses and one of her greatest joys was passing on her musical talents to her grandson.

She was the former wife of **Donald Harren** of Enola and **George William Hare Jr.** of Harrisburg.

Surviving are a son, **Barry L. Harren** of Ridgeland, S.C.; a daughter, **Jorja Barton** of Harrisburg; five grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by a brother, **Robert Collier**.

A musical celebration of her life was held May 22 in Wesley United Methodist Church, Marysville.

Burial was in Chestnut Grove Cemetery, Marysville.
