He entered the Army on June 23 1941, and trained at Camp Wheeler, Fort Benning and Camp Gordon, Ga.; Fort Jackson, S.C. and Camp Gordon Johnston, Fla., before being sent overseas last January.

Perry County Times, New Bloomfield, PA, August 24, 1944

Duncannon, Aug 22. – Wounded three times in Northern France, **Pvt. George R. Harp**, is back in action again, his mother, **Mrs. Ellen Dudley**, Valley Street has learned. He is in the Infantry. He was wounded by enemy fire on D-Day. The War Department also reported he was seriously wounded June 14, in a telegram received about a month later. He was wounded the third time July 25, but returned to duty a few days later, his mother learned. **Mrs. Dudley** has received the Purple Heart awarded to her son. **Private Harp** entered the Army Jun 23, 1941. He is with the Fourth Division and arrived overseas in January of this year.

Evening News, Harrisburg, September 4, 1944

Mrs. Ellen Harp, of Lower Duncannon received word this week that the body of her son, **Pfc**. **George Harp** would arrive, in Duncannon, for burial in about three weeks. **Harp** was killed in action during the invasion of Normandy

Duncannon, Sept. 4. – Two Duncannon soldiers have been killed, one in France and the other in India, according to War Department telegrams received by their families.

Pfc. George R. Harp, 26, son of **Mrs**. **Ellen Dudley**, Valley Street, was killed in action in Northern France, August 7.

Pvt. Harp, who was in the infantry, entered the service June 23, 1941. He trained at Fort Jackson, S.C., Camp Gordon Johnston, Fla., and in Georgia. He arrived overseas last January.

He was a member of the Duncannon Fire Company and American Legion Post 340.

Surviving in addition to his mother, are four half brothers, **James Dochterman**, at home; **Cpl**. **Edward Dudley**, serving with the Signal Corps in New Guinea; **Raymond Dudley**, of Navy, training at Bainbridge, Md., and **Benjamin Dudley**, at home.
