

Amelia Jane (Ebright) Hartzell, (10 Aug 1843 – 16 Jul 1913), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

Amelia J., wife of **George A. Hartzell** of Aqueduct, died at the home of her son **Christian Hartzell** of Marysville on Wednesday of last week of Bright's disease and a paralytic stroke, aged 69 years, 11 months and 6 days. **Mrs. Hartzell** made a visit to her son in April, shortly afterward becoming ill of Bright's disease and was unable to return home. She was a daughter of **John Ebright** and was born August 10, 1843, near Dellville. Early in life she became united with the United Brethren church in which she has ever since remained a consistent and faithful member.

July 21, 1859, she was married to **George A. Hartzell** in Duncannon. As a result of this union twenty-three children were born, seven of whom, with the husband, remain to mourn her departure, as follows: **Mrs. Sallie Mutzabaugh**, York; **Daniel**, Newport, **Lorenzo**, Harrisburg; **Christian**, Marysville; **Mrs. Sophia Holmes**, Harrisburg; **Alfred**, Aqueduct; **Mrs. Effie Seigler**, VanDyke. A brother, **Henry C. Ebright**, Shermansdale, and a sister, **Mrs. Catherine Robinson** of Harrisburg also survive her.

Mrs. Hartzell, during her life time lived in the vicinity in which she was born and was an estimable lady enjoying the confidence and esteem of her many friends and neighbors.

A short service was held at the home of her son in Marysville on Saturday at 7:30 p.m. and her body was taken in Duncannon on Sunday morning where funeral services were held in the United Brethren Church, Rev. S. C. Stonesifer officiating.
