

**George Ambrose Hartzell**, (29 Apr 1836 – 10 Nov 1914)

Newport News November 13, 1914 **George A. Hartzell**, aged 78 years, notice of whose death of general debility at his home at Aqueduct early Tuesday morning was published in The News of the same day, was a blacksmith by trade, carrying on business in Duncannon. Retiring from this business, he removed to Carroll Township where he engaged in farming for several years, later removing to Aqueduct where he resided until his death. July 21, 1859 he married Miss **Amelia J. Ebright** of near Dellville, who died July 17, 1913. Four sons and three daughters survive him, namely: **Daniel B.**, this place; **Lorenzo F.** and **Mrs. Harry Holmes**, Harrisburg; **Christian H.**, Marysville; **Alfred S.** at home; **Mrs. Harry Mutzabaugh**, York; **Mrs. Dewey Seigler** of Van Dyke. The funeral was yesterday at 2:30 p.m. Services were conducted by Rev. F. T. Kohler in the Duncannon United Brethren church and the interment was in the adjoining cemetery.

The Patriot November 11, 1914 **George A. Hartzell** Dies at Aqueduct - Duncannon Nov 10 - **George A. Hartzell** died at his home, at Aqueduct, three miles northeast of her, at 4.20 o'clock this morning of heart trouble and dropsy, aged 77 years, 6 months and 11 days. He was the father of 23 children, seven of whom survive him: **Mrs. Harry Mutzabaugh** of York; **Mrs. Harry Holmes**, of Harrisburg; **Mrs. Dewey Seigler**, of Van Dyke; **D. B. Hartzell**, of Newport; **L. F. Hartzell**, of Marysville; **A. S. Hartzell** of Aqueduct. His wife died in July 1912. The deceased was born and lived all of his life in Perry County and for forty years followed the trade of blacksmith. The funeral services will be held in the U. B. Church at 2.30 o'clock Thursday. Interment will be made in the U. B. Cemetery.
