**Haverstick, Harry W.**, railroad agent, was born in Duncannon, Perry County, Pa., November 4, 1856; son of **Michael** and **Susan (Meyers) Haverstick**. **Michael Haverstick** was born in Cumberland County, Pa. He was a miller, and settled in Perry County in 1853. He enlisted in 1864 in the Sixteenth United States infantry. He died at Chattanooga, Tenn., in 1864, from disease contracted in the army. His wife, **Susan Meyers**, was also a native of Cumberland County. They had eleven children; seven are now living, of whom **Harry W.** is the fifth. After the death of his father **Harry W. Haverstick** removed, with his mother, to Millersburg, where he was educated. He attended the public schools, and was a pupil of the Soldiers' Orphans' schools, of Paradise, Lancaster County and White Hall, Cumberland County; in the latter he was the first student entered. In 1871 he engaged with the Northern Central railway as clerk at Millersburg, was promoted in 1881 to ticket and freight agent, and has filled that position ever since.

**Mr. Haverstick** has been notary public in Lykens since 1891. He was formerly a stockholder and director in the Lykens Bank. He is president of the school board of Lykens for the third term. He is a Republican, and a member of Wiconisco Lodge, I. O. O. F.

**Mr. Haverstick** was married, in 1878, to **Miss Elizabeth**, daughter of **Benjamin Schreiber**, of Cumberland County, Pa. Their children are: **Edna L.**, **A. Mildred**, and **Park W.** The family attend the Methodist Episcopal Church.
