**Patriot, Saturday, March 29, 1902**

HENCH – On March 28<sup>th</sup>, 1902, at 8.30 a.m., **Nicholas Paul Hench**, son of **Nicholas Ickes** and **Anne Ellen Hench**, in the twenty-fifth year of his age. **Patriot, Saturday, March 29, 1902.** N. P. Hench Dead. Well Known Young Business Man Expires At Harrisburg Hospital From Appendicitis.

**Nicholas Paul Hench**, son of **N. I. Hench**, expired at the Harrisburg Hospital at 8.30 yesterday morning, aged 25 years. He was taken to the hospital Wednesday morning and operated on for appendicitis in the afternoon. After the operation his condition seemed to improve, but later he became worse and death resulted.

Deceased was a junior partner of N. I. Hench and Company, of 14 south Second Street. He displayed a talent for business and conducted a large part of the firm's transactions out of this city. He was a graduate of the Harrisburg Academy and studied at Yale University for two years.

The funeral services will be conducted by Rev. J. Ritchie Smith at the deceased's home, 1015 North Front Street, at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The interment will take place in the East Harrisburg Cemetery.

The members of the City Grays will meet at the armory on Sunday at 3.30 o'clock to take action on the death of Mr. Hench, who was a guardsman for a number of years.

**Patriot, Monday, March 31, 1902. Hench Obsequies.**

**Nicholas P. Hench** was buried from the home of his parents, 1015 North Front Street, Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. His friends attended in large numbers and many floral tributes were received. The services were conducted by Rev. J. Ritchie Smith, assisted by Rev. Luther DeYoe. The interment took place in East Harrisburg Cemetery.
