HENCH, SAMUEL, merchant, was born in Perry County, Penn., Aug. 14, 1813; his father died when **Samuel** was but a few years old, and the raising of the family devolved upon his mother, who was compelled to put the children out; his mother bound him to **John Bull**, of Perry County, Penn., for five years, to work on a farm; he had but limited advantages to attend school; he was indentured to **Jacob Ickes**, of Perry County, three years, to learn the milling trade; he followed milling at different places for twenty-five years; he was appointed Postmaster at Roseburg, Perry County, Penn., by W. T. Barry, Postmaster General, May 24, 1834; he served three years; he came to Ohio in the fall of 1849 and settled in Richland County, Ohio; he moved to Shiloh in the spring of 1861; he was appointed Postmaster March 22, 1864, by Mr. Blair, Postmaster General, and served very acceptably for thirteen years and six months. He was married to **Miss Eliza Delancy**, of Perry County, Penn., Aug. 14, 1833; they had one son— **Peter**, born Sept. 26, 1834.
