

Marlin E. Hile, (22 May 1929 – 19 Jan 2013), Perry County Times, Thursday, January 31, 2013

Marlin E. “Moody” “Dirty Duck” **Hile**, 83, of New Bloomfield, formerly of Mt. Pleasant Mills, died Saturday, Jan. 19, 2013 at The Manor at Perry Village, New Bloomfield.

He was born May 22, 1929 in Krazterville to the late **Phenie** and **Beulah (Kratzer) Hile**.

He was employed with the Pennsylvania Railroad, Van Dyke Brick Company, Central Steel, road construction companies, and retired after 23 years with Poloron Homes as a truck driver; attended Locust Grove and Houtz grammar schools; an Army Air Corps and Air Force veteran after World War II and during the Korean War, serving in England and Germany, and marched in the first Air Force parade at Bolling Field in Washington, D.C.; a member of Oriental Sportsmen’s Club, Liverpool American Legion Post 364, Home Association of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 5640, Middleburg, Freeburg Fire Company, Loyal Order of Moose Lodge 1229, Middleburg, and a lifetime member of Kreamer Fire Company; provided transportation for the local Mennonite community; and enjoyed fishing and playing the lottery.

He was the widower of **Nancy (Ferry) Hile**, who died March 2, 1989.

Surviving are a daughter, **Catherine S. Murphy** of Newport; three grandchildren, **Yvonne Moyer**, **Sheri Murphy** and **Jackie Murphy**; five great-grandchildren, **Cody**, **Adam**, **Aron**, **Ashleigh** and **Lexie**; a brother, **Jim “Pickle” Hile** of Mt. Pleasant Mills; a sister, **Dorothy Swartz** of Mifflintown; and many nieces and nephews.

He was preceded by two brothers, **Lester G.** and **Warren A.**

Services were held Jan. 24 in George P. Garman Funeral Home, Mt. Pleasant Mills, with Pastor George A. Swartz officiating.

Burial, with military honors by Selinsgrove American Legion Victory Post 25 and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6631, was made in Daniel’s Cemetery, Mt. Pleasant Mills.
