

Charles D. Hollenbaugh, (1865 – 26 Jul 1922), Patriot, Thursday, July 27, 1922.
Railroad Engineer For Thirty-Three Years Dies.

Charles D. Hollenbaugh, 57 years old, passenger engineer of the Middle Division of the Pennsylvania Railroad, died yesterday morning at his home, 429 Peffer Street. He was an employee of the Pennsylvania System for the last thirty three years, and a member of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, No. 459.

Surviving him are his wife, Mrs. **Siddie Hollenabugh**; two daughters, **Ruth** and **Dorothy**, at home; his mother, Mrs. **Sarah Hollenbaugh**, of Newport; one brother, **Harry Hollenbaugh**, of Harrisburg; and four sisters, **Mrs. H. L. Earnest**, Harrisburg; **Mrs. Wesley Snyder**, Newport; **Mrs. Harry Burd**, Loysville, and **Mrs. Harry Foch**, of Philadelphia.
