

John Hopple (6 Jan 1853 – 26 Mar 1920), The News, of Newport, Pa. March 30, 1920

John Hopple, former Pennsy employee died of kidney trouble at 9:30 Friday morning at the home of his daughter, **Mrs. Howard Wood**, 317 8th Street, Juniata.

Mr. Hopple was born January 6, 1853 in Perry County on what is known as the Hopple estate in Howe Township and during the last six years made his home with his daughter, **Mrs. Wood** and husband. His wife died six years ago.

He was a son of **John and Mattie (Gable) Hopple**, both deceased of this county. Surviving are his two children, **Mrs. Annie Wood** of Juniata and **Amos G. Hopple** of Pittsburgh; his stepson, **H.C. Jones** of Pittsburgh; four grand children, two great-grandchildren, two sisters, Mrs. **Martha Poff** of Duncannon and Mrs. **Rebecca Freeburn** of Halifax, and one half-sister, Mrs. **Louise Freeland** of East Newport.

Mr. Hopple was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Juniata; but, in the absence of a west end pastor, services over the remains of Mr. Hopple were conducted by the Rev. T.S. Dickson of the Juniata Presbyterian church.

Services were held at his late home Monday morning at 9:30 o'clock, after which the body was brought to Newport, at 2 p.m., and taken to the Methodist Episcopal Church, at which the Rev. Wesley N. Wright of Marysville Church of God preached the sermon, and was assisted in the services by Rev. F.T. Bell.
