

**A. Russell Kipp** (4 Sep 1876 – 23 May 1915), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

Newport, May 25th; **A. Russell Kipp** died of typhoid fever on Sunday at 7:10 a.m. at his home on North Fourth Street aged 38 years old. He was a well known railway mail clerk, and became ill upon his return from his regular run, Harrisburg to Pittsburgh, five weeks ago. Until ten days ago his condition was considered favorable, but a week prior to his death he had a hemorrhage which very much weakened him, after which his steady decline was plainly seen until the end, his last few hours having been passed in an unconscious state.

He was the son of **John H.** and the late **Elizabeth (Kistler) Kipp**, and was born in this place September 4, 1876. He was educated in the Newport public schools, graduating in the class of 1895. He was employed as a railway mail clerk for sixteen years. He married **Miss Flora Kough**, daughter of **Mr. and Mrs. Ambrose Kough**, October 10, 1900. His wife and one daughter **Helen Margaret**, 6 years old, survive him. He leaves one brother, **Maurice W.**, and two sisters. **Miss Virginia Kipp** a teacher of grammar school, and **Miss Bird Kipp**, a trained nurse who was his nurse during his illness.

He was a member of the Methodist church and Sunday school from childhood, and of Newport Lodge, No. 381, F. A.&M. No. 102, I.O.O.F. Three members of each lodge will be pallbearers. His pastor Rev. J.C. Collins, will conduct the funeral services at the house tomorrow at 10 a.m. Interment will be in Newport Cemetery.
