Ray W. Kitner, 89, of Shermans Dale died Tuesday, Sept. 6, 2011 at his Carroll Twp. home.

He was born Nov. 25, 1921 in New Bloomfield to **Amos** and **Mary (Gibbney) Kitner**.

He retired from the Mechanicsburg Naval Supply Depot; a Navy veteran of World War II, serving as a machinist mate first class and onboard a ship commissioned to Pearl Harbor during the invasion and was actively involved in the battle; a member of the former Roseglan Brethren in Christ Church and the Liverpool VFW; and enjoyed helping others, farming, sawmilling with his brothers, hunting and raising pigs.

Surviving are his wife of 65 years, **Janice Ickes Kitner**; four sons, **Amos** of Middleboro, Mass, **William** of Newport, **Donald** of Dillsburg and **Steve** of Shermans Dale; two daughters, **Linda Stone** of Millerstown and **Barbara Goodling** of Newport; 13 grandchildren; and 23 great-grandchildren.

Services were held Sept. 9 in Boyer Funeral Home, New Bloomfield, with the Rev. Brandon Byler officiating. Burial, with military honors, was in Bloomfield Cemetery.
