

**Daniel Aumiller Kline**, (8 Nov 1877 – 29 Nov 1943), From the Peoples Advocate and Press, November, 1943

County Superintendent of Schools **D.A. Kline**, of this place, died in the Germantown Hospital, Philadelphia, Pa. Monday evening about 7 o'clock, from the effects of a major operation performed November 24th, and several subsequent operations. He was apparently recovering when it is believed a blood-clot from an abdominal incision was injected into his bloodstream and carried to his heart, causing sudden death. He was aged 66 years.

The announcement of his death was a sad shock to his family and many friends.

**Daniel Aumiller Kline** was a son of Ex-Associate Judge, **John L. Kline**, deceased, of Liverpool Township. His elementary education was obtained in the township schools and the Bloomfield Academy, after which he was graduated from Lock Haven Normal School, and Lafayette College.

He began his educational career as a school teacher, having taught in Huntingdon and Juniata counties and then was principal of the Marysville schools. In 1908 he was elected County Superintendent of Schools and since then was re-elected each succeeding three years and was serving his twelfth term a period of thirty-six years at the time of his death, the longest period any County Superintendent in the State has ever held the office.

He was a member of the Bloomfield, Lutheran church and held various church offices, also a member of Adams Lodge, No. 319, F&AM, this place: Harrisburg Lodge of Perfection, Scottish Rite, Mason and Mackinaw Lodge, I.O.O.F. Bloomfield.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. **Julia Radle Kline**, and three daughters, **Miss Sarah N. Kline**, Philadelphia; **Margaret Kline (Mrs. Stanhope Roddy)** Bloomfield; and **Carolyn, (Mrs. H.K. Hays)** Ambler, Pa. also two sisters, **Miss Sue Kline**, Liverpool, and **Edna (Mrs. Francis Ward Balcomb)** Waycross, Ga.; and one brother, **John Kline**, Liverpool.

Funeral services will be held at the Myers Funeral home, Newport, Friday morning at 10:30 his pastor, Rev. Donald L. Rhoads, officiating and burial will be in Bloomfield cemetery, with the rites of Free Masons.
