

Milton S. Kline, (2 Oct 1867 - 21 Feb 1943), Duncannon Record, Thursday, March 4, 1943

Milton Hershey Kline, at the age of 75 years, a former resident of Loysville, Pa., was laid to rest last week in Harrisburg, Pa.

He drove team and was employed on the farm of **John** and **Priscilla Minich**, one-fourth mile below Loysville. A tad slender boy with a big heart, he was always looking after the pleasure of others.

He used to help trim the big hay wagon with branches of pine and spruce, then load up all the children he could find and to the music of the bells on the hoses, away they would go to the famous old picnic grounds at **Stambaugh's** Woods. I believe he was the happiest one in the crowd. When the day was over her would gather the children together again and a happy but tired lot of youngsters were on their way home. That was 57 years ago.

I used to visit him at his home in Harrisburg and we would piece together the many happy events of past years.

He had a host of friends and was greatly interested in church work. I have no doubt many grandfathers and grandmothers will recall those happy days when they were youngsters and rode with him to those picnics.

Once when attacked by two vicious dogs he saved my life. It affords me great pleasure to recall just a few of his acts of kindness.

He certainly will be greatly missed and I shall always remember him as a Christian gentleman.
