Steelton mill's first female foreman dies

**Barbara A. Klinger**, 59, of Upper Allen Twp., died Saturday in Holy Spirit Hospital, East Pennsboro Twp.

She was a retired pipe mill supervisor for Bethlehem Steel Corp., Steelton Plant, where she worked for 22 years; and a former Sister of the Missionary Servants of the Blessed Trinity where she was known as Sister Andrew Marie.

'She was a faithful employee since 1977. She'll be sadly missed by the employees,' said General Foreman Dennis Nelson of Cornwall.

'She's the first woman foreman we had in the steel plant,' he said. 'A lot of the guys liked working for her.'

She was a member of Christ Lutheran Church, Harrisburg, and the Gang's Trivia Club. She enjoyed gardening, poetry, nature and trips to Atlantic City.

Surviving is a companion, **Jill Dimpsey**; two sons, **Mark A.** of Newport and **Matthew R.** of Newark, Del.; a sister, **Mary Lou Kelly** of Harrisburg; three brothers, **Eugene J. Karl**, **J. David Karl** and **Francis S. Karl** all of Harrisburg; a granddaughter, **Sydney Klinger**; and nieces and nephews.

Services will be held at 10 a.m. Thursday in her church. Private committal will be at the convenience of the family.

Viewing will be from 6 to 8 p.m. Wednesday with a Celebration of Life service at 7: 30 p.m. in the Parthemore Funeral Home, New Cumberland.
