

**Arthur Clair Landis**, (Died 6 May 1942), The Patriot, Harrisburg, May 7, 1942 Arthur Landis, Newport, Dies. Former European Manager of Swift and Company Succumbs in Hospital.

**Arthur Clair Landis**, of Newport, former European manager for Swift and Company, died yesterday afternoon at the Bryn Mawr Hospital where he had been a patient for several weeks. He was 67 years old.

Born in Newville, Cumberland County, he was graduated from the high school of that borough and later learned the watch making trade.

Becoming associated with the Swift and Company in 1899, Landis was sent to Cuba, where he served the firm for more than a year before being stationed at Wilmington, N.C.

Becomes Cuban Manager. Later he was made Cuban manager for the firm and was located in Cuba until 1919, when he was again transferred, this time to Europe as continental manager; retiring in 1933 he located to Newport.

Fought in Cuba. A veteran of the Spanish-American war, Landis was in active service in Cuba. He was a member of the Newville Church of God and the Men's Bible Class of the Newport Methodist Church.

He is survived by his wife, **Mrs. Bertha Rippman Landis**, two sons, **Charles A.**, Paradise, Lancaster County, and **Arthur C. Landis, Jr.**, of Washington; two daughters, **Mrs. Elmer Baker**, Newport; **Mrs. Peter Christie**, Maplewood, N.J., and **Miss Mary Landis**, Lancaster; two brothers, **George B.**, of Oberlin, Ohio, and **John E.**, Newville.

Funeral services will be held at 2.30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at his home, Fourth and Walnut Streets, Newport, the Rev. E. L. Lewis, former pastor of the Newport Methodist Church, officiating, assisted by the Rev. S. E. Vance, pastor of Wormleysburg Church of God, and the Rev. L. Stoy Spangler, pastor of Newport Lutheran Church. Burial will be in Newport Cemetery.
