

Simon Lick, (1 May 1855 – 4 ay 1925), Duncannon Record, May 7, 1925

Simon Lick, aged 70, retired employee of the .P. R. R. died Monday morning in the University Hospital, Philadelphia, where he had gone for an operation for gall stones shortly before. **Mr. Lick** began his railroad career under the N. C. R. as a section hand, May 14, 1871. Two years later he was transferred to the transportation department as a brakeman. He filled different positions as flagman and conductor for twenty-four years. He was promoted to assistant yard-master in 1902 and a year later was promoted to yard-master and when the Penna. System took over the N. C; R. he was retained in the same position. While under the N. C, R. services he was in charge of the old camp meeting ground for the rail road, acting as ticket agent, dispatcher and overseer. **Mr. Lick** was a lifelong church member belonging to Trinity Reformed Church in his hometown of Marysville. He filled many of the offices of the church and Sunday school and was instrumental in organizing the Men's Bible classes in this district.

At the convention of the Perry County Sabbath School Association at Liverpool three years ago, he was elected president of that organization and served until death called him home. He planned the last executive meeting of that organization when arrangements were made for the convention this year. Besides being a member of the railroad organization, he was a member of Perry Lodge. No. 458, F. & A. M. He is survived by his **widow**, two sons **Alton** and **Clarence**, and three daughters, **Helen** at home, **Mrs. Mary E. Swisher** of Harrisburg, and **Mrs. Grace Maxwell** of Harrisburg.

Funeral services were held from his late home on William Street, Marysville, then at the Reformed Church, with interment in Chestnut Grove cemetery Wednesday afternoon.
