

**William H. Lightner**, (1839 – 8 Aug 1911), Perry County Democrat, Wednesday, August 16, 1911

Another old veteran has answered the last roll call. **William H. Lightner** passed away Thursday evening of last week at his home near Grier's Point, after an illness of several months' duration, aged 72 years 8 months, 6 days.

The deceased was a son of the late **Sterrett Lightner**, of near Landisburg. For many years he resided near Alinda. He is survived by his wife, who before her marriage was a **Miss Elizabeth Diven**, a daughter of **Richard Diven**; also one daughter, **Mrs. John A. Crozier**, of Marysville, and two granddaughters, **Ruth H.** and **Anna M.**

The following brothers and sisters are living; **David P. Lightner**, of Grier's Point; **James**, of Nebraska; **Theodore**, of North Dakota; **Martha**, (**Mrs. David Stambaugh**) of Elliottsburg; **Malinda**, (**Mrs. Theodore Bryner**) of Cisna Run, and **Harriet**, (**Mrs. William Neely**) of Loysville.

**Mr. Lightner** was a veteran of the Civil War and was a brave soldier. He was a consistent member of the Church of God and was a good and highly respected man.

His remains were laid to rest on Sunday in the Bethel cemetery at Grier's Point, Rev. Tyler, of Marysville, conducting the services. The pallbearers were **Henry Fenicle**, **Wesley Fenicle**, **James Baum**, and **Jesse Smeigh**.
