Hardy W. Love, 76, of Harrisburg, formerly of Millersburg, was called to his Heavenly home on September 10, 2011.

He was born on May 19, 1935 to **Ernest** and **Pauline Love** of Bucks County, who preceded him in death along with three brothers and two sisters.

Hardy leaves behind his wife **Jean** of fifty-one years, and also daughters **Barbara** of Harrisburg and **Susan Fitzpatrick (John)** of Hilliard, OH and grandsons **Michael** and **Steven**; also a sister **Ellie Kerns (John)** of Blooming Glen and three nieces and a nephew. Hardy earned his educational degrees from The Pennsylvania State University.

He began his teaching career at Upper Dauphin Area High School in 1958, teaching industrial arts education for many years until he became the cooperative education coordinator for the district. Hardy retired in 1993 after thirty-five years. He continued to be a successful G.E.D. instructor for H.A.C.C. helping many adults earn their high school diplomas. Hardy was a member of NEA, PASR, Dauphin County Retired Teachers, and Penn State Alumna Association. He also was a member of Millersburg Masonic Lodge #364 and Tall Cedars Lodge #125. Hardy was a former member and volunteer of the Ned Smith Center. Hardy was a skilled carpenter and all-around handyman. He also was a faithful servant of Trinity UCC in Millersburg, serving many years as a consistory member, teacher, and lay minister. He recently became a member of Colonial Park UCC.
