

Blanche B. (Coulter) Lupfer, (5 Feb 1879 – Feb 1918), Newspaper Clipping The People's Advocate and Press, The Perry Historians

Blanche B. beloved wife of **B. B. Lupfer**, optometrist, of this place, died Monday evening at 6:30 o'clock after weary months suffering from Bright's disease. The disease developed about eighteen months ago, since which time despite the best of medical treatment in hospitals in Philadelphia and Harrisburg and by her own physician at home she gradually failed until death claimed her. She was brought home six weeks prior to her death.

The deceased was the daughter of **Mr. and Mrs. John H. Coulter**, the latter now dead, and was born in Reedsville, Mifflin County, Pa. and at her death was aged 39 years, and 13 days. In the year 1900, she wedded to **B. B. Lupfer** of this place, to whom were born three children, all surviving: **M. Janette, John H.**, and **Edward Casper**, all at home. There also survive the following sisters and brothers; **Ettie, Mrs. Laurie Weller, Mrs. Jack Miller, Mabel**, of Reedsville, and **Mrs. V. Grant Forrer**, of Harrisburg.

Mrs. Lupfer was a consistent member of the M.E. Church and as long as health permitted was active in the various branches of church work, from which she will be greatly missed. In the little family circle she found her chief pleasure. She was a loving mother and wife and her death is most keenly felt by her devoted husband and her children, as well as a large circle of friends and relatives.

Funeral services will be held at their late residence Thursday morning, her pastor, Rev. H.C. Knox, officiating. Interment in the New Bloomfield Cemetery.
