

Benjamin P. McIntire, Esquire, (1845 – 16 Apr 1887), Perry County Democrat, April 20, 1887,

After an illness of about three weeks, **Ben P. McIntire**, Esq. died at his residence in Steelton on last Saturday, April 16. He was the youngest son of the late **Benjamin McIntire**, Esq. of this borough, and the only brother of **Hon. C.J.T. McIntire**, who died about one year ago. He was a graduate of Dickinson College; was clerk to the County Commissioners from 1863 to 1865; studied law in his father's office and was admitted to practice in the courts of this county Oct. 1868; he was elected District Attorney in 1869 and served for three years. Having a dislike for the Profession, he entered the service of the P.R.R. Co. at Harrisburg; thence he removed to Steelton and accepted employment at the Steel Works. He possessed a most kind and genial nature, was large-hearted and generous to a fault and the announcement of his death caused deep regret in the hearts of all who knew him here. His remains were interred in the Bloomfield Cemetery on Monday afternoon. He leaves a widow but no children. His age was 42 years, 8 months and 8 days.
